- 0-10 fg orange sand
- 10-20 brittle stiff blue-gray clay (Oron?)
- 20-25 gray sand, fg-granule, angular,
poorly sorted, indur white feldspar
- 25-30 stiff blue gray clay again
- 30-35 "beaky" well sorted fg sand
w/ some dark grains
- 35-40 as for 20-25'

• 40-45 fine sand w/ abundant "g"
granules, light tan (cong)

• 45-50 fine sd, some dark gray, common
cg-granule

• 50-55 granules, mostly ^{orig} gtz, some white
feldspar, w/ fg-ing sand matrix

• 55-60 fg 'beaky' sand, clean, well sorted,

~~well~~ some veg & a few granules (from
"beak"?)

• 60-65 org-fg sand, some veg & granules

• 65-70 A/A, fewer granules

• 70-90 mix of small pebbles (to 2cm)

granules, some sand w/ ^{bad} chunks of

dark dark gray clay w/ fine organics

plus some chunks of silty fine sand

(esp. from 80-90)

9 1-95 Fine (some med) sand, clean,

well sorted

95-100 med-fine sand, clean, a few shells

verts - granule

• 100-105 gtz pebbles & clasts of

dark gray soft clay, pebbles to 2cm

• 105-110 A/A but w/ clasts of red silt & white clay

• 110-115 Sandy (vf) ^{clayey} dark grayish mud

w/ a few gtz pebble frags & red mud frags

• 115-120 A/A, but much less pebbles & red

• 120-130 A/A, but w/ ^{a few} granules (gtz, chert) instead

of pebbles (from above covered?)

Bs - 140 Slightly sandy (vf) sticky dark gray clay

• 140-150 silty to slightly sandy (vf) sticky

dark gray clay (some mica flakes)

• 150-205 silty sticky gray clay w/ fine

shell fragments (St Mary's)

• 205-230 A/A but w/ noticeable vf sand

and more abd & thicker shell frags

• 230-235 mix of brown chocolate clay &

^{slightly} clayey, sandy (vf) soft ^{red-} greenish-gray

silt w/ thicker shell frags

• ~~235~~ ²⁷⁰ soft med greenish gray sandy (vf)

silt w/ common shell frags -

more shell down ward? more clay?

• 270-290 A/A, but sandier?

• 290-330 A/A ^{less sandy,} but clayey? fewer shells

(but still common) clay increases ^{dark} brown
